

D. The Person of Christ

1. His Names

a. **Jesus**= Saviour

Philippians 2:9-10 “Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: (10) That at the name of Jesus...”

Matthew 1:21 “And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.”

- The core of the coming of Jesus was to fulfil the will of the Father by dying for the sin of God’s people.

John 12:27 “Now is my soul troubled; and what shall I say? Father, save me from this hour: but for this cause came I unto this hour.”

Hebrews 12:2 “Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.”

- Who for the joy that was set before Him endure the cross: Jesus did not esteem the cross itself as a joyful occasion. Jesus rejoiced in fulfilling the Will of God by saving us! Jesus looked past the agony and endured the cross for the glory of God and for our Salvation.
- Despising the shame: One of the most evident components of the torture of the cross was its extreme shame. Jesus did not anticipate or invite shame - He despised it! - Yet He endured through the shame for US!!!

b. **Christ**=Messiah, anointed, the Holy one of God.

Matthew 16:15-16 “He saith unto them, But whom say ye that I am?(16) And Simon Peter answered and said, Thou art the Christ, the Son of the living God.”

- Jesus is Israel’s promised Messiah.
- The “Messiah” is the Hebrew equivalent for Christ.
- Messiah refers to a Prophet, Priest, and Kings that have been anointed by God. The anointing of oil is a symbolized consecration for ministry given by God.
- Jesus Christ, as the Anointed One, would be the ultimate Prophet, Priest, and King.
- Even the devils recognized Jesus as the Christ.

Mark 1:24 "Saying, Let us alone; what have we to do with thee, thou Jesus of Nazareth? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art, the Holy One of God."

c. **Jesus of Nazareth** =The humble name of the Lord during His earthly ministry

- Matthew 21:11; Mark 10:47; Luke 24:19; John 18:5.

John 1:45-46 "Philip findeth Nathanael, and saith unto him, We have found him, of whom Moses in the law, and the prophets, did write, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph. (46) And Nathanael said unto him, Can there any good thing come out of Nazareth? Philip saith unto him, Come and see."

- Galileans despised people from Nazareth. Nathanael was from Cana, another town in Galilee, and, it seemed impossible to Nathanael that the Messiah would live in such a poor neighborhood.
- In some cultures the village you are from plays a big part towards being accepted. Only if Nathanael knew the origin of Jesus. Remember, Jesus made Himself of no reputation. Made Poor so we would be made rich.

Matthew 2:23 "And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, He shall be called a Nazarene."

Acts 2:22 "Ye men of Israel, hear these words; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know:"

d. **The Son of Man** =It is a title expressing His total humanity.

- This title is used over 80 times in the New Testament—Jesus Himself using it about 40 times.

John 5:27 "And hath given him authority to execute judgment also, because he is the Son of man."

Acts 13:38 "Be it known unto you therefore, men and brethren, that through this man is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins:"

1 Timothy 2:5 "For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;"

- e. **The Son of God**=It is a title expressing His total divinity.

Mark 1:1 "The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God;"

- 1) The Disciples acknowledge Jesus to be the "Son of God"

Matthew 14:31-33 "And immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt?(32) And when they were come into the ship, the wind ceased. (33) Then they that were in the ship came and worshipped him, saying, Of a truth thou art the Son of God."

- 2) The Devils acknowledge Jesus to be the "Son of God"

Matthew 8:29 "And, behold, they cried out, saying, What have we to do with thee, Jesus, thou Son of God? art thou come hither to torment us before the time?"

- Notice how Satan tries to tempt Jesus.

Matthew 4:3 "And when the tempter came to him, he said, If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread."

- Why does Satan use this title with Jesus?

- 3) Pilates acknowledge Jesus to be the "Son of God"

- Jesus was accused of Blasphemy because He called Himself the Son of God.

Luke 22:70 "Then said they all, Art thou then the Son of God? And he said unto them, Ye say that I am."

- Notice what the Pharisees ask Jesus.

Matthew 26:63-65 "But Jesus held his peace. And the high priest answered and said unto him, I adjure thee by the living God, that thou tell us whether thou be the Christ, the Son of God. (64) Jesus saith unto him, Thou hast said: nevertheless I say unto you, Hereafter shall ye see the Son of man sitting on the right hand of power, and coming in the clouds of heaven.(65) Then the high priest rent his clothes, saying, He hath spoken blasphemy; what further need have we of witnesses? behold, now ye have heard his blasphemy."

- f. **Master**= This is demonstrated Jesus' divine authority on earth.

- Another name for Master is "Rabbi" – The Teacher.

Matthew 8:19 "And a certain scribe came, and said unto him, Master, I will follow thee whithersoever thou goest."

John 11:28 “And when she had so said, she went her way, and called Mary her sister secretly, saying, The Master is come, and calleth for thee.”

Matthew 23:8 “But be not ye called Rabbi: for one is your Master, even Christ; and all ye are brethren.”

- CH Spurgeon is not the Prince of Preachers, Jesus is!!! Knowing the writings of Charles Spurgeon he will agree.

Vernon McGee “Be not ye called Rabbi”—meaning teacher. And in the church certain respect and honor belongs to a pastor, but he is no different from anyone else. He is just one of your brothers.

- g. **Emmanuel** =This name refers to His Divine Presence on earth (God with us)

Matthew 1:23 “Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.”

- Isaiah 7:14
- No one ever called Christ “Immanuel” while on earth; He was always called “Jesus”. However, the meaning of the name “Immanuel” indicates the presence of God with us through Jesus Christ.
- The virgin birth reflects the fact that God is with us through Jesus Christ. If a person rejects the virgin birth, they reject the deity of Christ.

- h. **Lord, God** =This refers to His deity (100% God)

Luke 2:11 “For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord.”

Luke 6:46 “And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say”

John 20:28 “And Thomas answered and said unto him, My Lord and my God.”

Luke 19:28-35 “And when he had thus spoken, he went before, ascending up to Jerusalem. (29) And it came to pass, when he was come nigh to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount called the mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, (30) Saying, Go ye into the village over against you; in the which at your entering ye shall find a colt tied, whereon yet never man sat: loose him, and bring him hither.(31) And if any man ask you, Why do ye loose him? thus shall ye say unto him, Because the Lord hath need of him.(32) And they that were sent went their way, and found even as he had said unto them. (33) And as they were loosing the colt, the owners thereof said unto them, Why loose ye the colt? (34) And they said, The Lord hath need of him. (35) And they

brought him to Jesus: and they cast their garments upon the colt, and they set Jesus thereon.”

John 13:13 *“Ye call me Master and Lord: and ye say well; for so I am.”*

1 John 5:20 *“And we know that the Son of God is come, and hath given us an understanding, that we may know him that is true, and we are in him that is true, even in his Son Jesus Christ. This is the true God, and eternal life.”*

2. His Character

- **Note:** Jesus possessed and exhibited the attributes of God. The Natural and Moral attributes of God.

a. Natural Attributes

1) Omniscience

- Jesus knows all things (The Past and Future)

John 6:64 *“But there are some of you that believe not. For Jesus knew from the beginning who they were that believed not, and who should betray him.”*

John 4:29 *“Come, see a man, which told me all things that ever I did: is not this the Christ?”*

- Jesus knows the location of man

John 1:47-49 *“Jesus saw Nathanael coming to him, and saith of him, Behold an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile!(48) Nathanael saith unto him, Whence knowest thou me? Jesus answered and said unto him, Before that Philip called thee, when thou wast under the fig tree, I saw thee.(49) Nathanael answered and saith unto him, Rabbi, thou art the Son of God; thou art the King of Israel.”*

- Jesus knows the inner heart of man

John 2:24-25 *“But Jesus did not commit himself unto them, because he knew all men,(25) And needed not that any should testify of man: for he knew what was in man.”*

- Jesus knows the thoughts of man

Luke 6:7-8 *“And the scribes and Pharisees watched him, whether he would heal on the sabbath day; that they might find an accusation against him. (8) But he knew their thoughts, and said to the man which had the withered hand, Rise up, and stand forth in the midst. And he arose and stood forth.”*

2) Omnipotence

- Christ is declared as the “the Almighty”

Revelation 1:8 *“I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty.”*

- Christ has the power over life and death

John 10:18 *“No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This commandment have I received of my Father.”*

Revelation 1:18 *“I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death.”*

- Christ upholds and sustains all things, including the universe, with His mighty power

Hebrews 1:3 *“Who being the brightness of his glory, and the express image of his person, and upholding all things by the word of his power, when he had by himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high;”*

Matthew 8:27 *“But the men marvelled, saying, What manner of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey him!”*

3) Omnipresence

- Christ was in Heaven while he was physically present on the earth.

John 3:13 *“And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven.”*

- Christ is on the earth while He is physically in Heaven —Matthew 18:20; 28:20.

Matthew 18:20 *“For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.”*

Matthew 28:20 *“Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.”*

- Christ indwells all believers

Ephesians 3:17 *“That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love,”*

4) Eternal

Micah 5:2 “*But thou, Bethlehem Ephratah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from of old, from everlasting.”*

- Christ was before John the Baptist (c. 5 B.C.)

John 1:15 “*John bare witness of him, and cried, saying, This was he of whom I spake, He that cometh after me is preferred before me: for he was before me.*”

- Christ was before Abraham (c. 2000 B.C.)

John 8:58 “*Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Before Abraham was, I am.*”

- Christ was before the world was created (c. 4000 B.C.)

John 17:5 “*And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was.*”

Revelation 1:11 “*Saying, I am Alpha and Omega, the first and the last...*”

5) Immutable

Hebrews 13:8 “*Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.*”

- The unchanging nature of Jesus Christ stems from His deity. God doesn't change over the ages, so neither does Jesus, who is God.
- **Notice the parallel passages.**

<p>Psalms 102:24-27 “<i>I said, O my God, take me not away in the midst of my days: thy years are throughout all generations. (25) Of old hast thou laid the foundation of the earth: and the heavens are the work of thy hands. (26) They shall perish, but thou shalt endure: yea, all of them shall wax old like a garment; as a vesture shalt thou change them, and they shall be changed: (27) But thou art the same, and thy years shall have no end</i></p>	<p>Hebrews 1:10-12 “<i>And, Thou, Lord, in the beginning hast laid the foundation of the earth; and the heavens are the works of thine hands: (11) They shall perish; but thou remainest; and they all shall wax old as doth a garment;(12) And as a vesture shalt thou fold them up, and they shall be changed: but thou art the same, and thy years shall not fail.</i>”</p>
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b. Moral Attributes

1) Holiness

- Hebrews 7:26 is a classic definition of Christ being HOLY!

Hebrews 7:26 “For such an high priest became us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and made higher than the heavens;”

- Christ is absolutely pure, holy and without sin.

Hebrews 4:15 “...but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin.”

2 Corinthians 5:21 “For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.”

1 Peter 2:21-22 “For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps: (22) Who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth:

1 John 3:5 “And ye know that he was manifested to take away our sins; and in him is no sin.”

- **Nobody could question the Holiness of Christ.**

John 8:46 “Which of you convinceth me of sin? And if I say the truth, why do ye not believe me?”

- **Even those who were His enemies testified of the Holiness of Christ.**

1) The unclean spirits — <i>Mark 1:23,24.</i>	<i>Mark 1:23-24</i> “And there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out,(24) Saying, Let us alone; what have we to do with thee, thou Jesus of Nazareth? art thou come to destroy us? I know thee who thou art, the <u>Holy One</u> of God.”
2) Judas Iscariot — <i>Matthew 27:3,4.</i>	<i>Matthew 27:3-4</i> “Then Judas, which had betrayed him, when he saw that he was condemned, repented himself, and brought again the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders,(4) Saying, I have sinned in that I have betrayed the <u>innocent blood</u> . And they said, What is that to us? see thou to that.”

<p>3) Pontius Pilate — <i>John 18:38.</i></p>	<p><i>John 18:38</i> “<i>Pilate saith unto him, What is truth? And when he had said this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto them, <u>I find in him no fault at all.</u>”</i></p>
<p>4) Pilate’s wife — <i>Matthew 27:19.</i></p>	<p><i>Matthew 27:19</i> “<i>When he was set down on the judgment seat, his wife sent unto him, saying, Have thou nothing to do with that <u>just man</u>: for I have suffered many things this day in a dream because of him.”</i></p>
<p>5) The dying thief — <i>Luke 23:41.</i></p>	<p><i>Luke 23:41</i> “<i>And we indeed justly; for we receive the due reward of our deeds: but this man hath done <u>nothing amiss.</u>”</i></p>
<p>6) The Roman centurion — <i>Luke 23:47.</i></p>	<p><i>Luke 23:47</i> “<i>Now when the centurion saw what was done, he glorified God, saying, Certainly this was a <u>righteous man.</u>”</i></p>
<p>7) The Religious rulers – <i>Mat 28:11-15</i></p> <p><i>Question:</i> Why did they have to bribe the Soldiers?</p>	<p><i>Matthew 28:11-15</i> “<i>Now when they were going, behold, some of the watch came into the city, and shewed unto the chief priests all the things that were done.(12) And when they were assembled with the elders, and had taken counsel, they gave large money unto the soldiers,(13) Saying, Say ye, His disciples came by night, and stole him away while we slept.(14) And if this come to the governor's ears, we will persuade him, and secure you.(15) So they took the money, and did as they were taught: and this saying is commonly reported among the Jews until this day.”</i></p>

2) Love

- Jesus Christ is the greatest expression and demonstration of love.
- Christ exhibits divine love by giving himself as a **SACRIFICE**.

<p><i>Jesus Loved the Church</i></p>	<p><i>Ephesians 5:25</i> “Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it;”</p>
<p><i>Jesus Loved Paul</i></p>	<p><i>Galatians 2:20</i> “I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.”</p>
<p><i>Jesus loved Lazarus</i></p>	<p><i>John 11:36</i> “Then said the Jews, Behold how he loved him!”</p>
<p><i>Jesus Loved John – the Apostle</i></p>	<p><i>John 13:23</i> “Now there was leaning on Jesus' bosom one of his disciples, whom Jesus loved.”</p>
<p><i>Jesus Loved the Rich man</i></p>	<p><i>Mark 10:21</i> “Then Jesus beholding him loved him, and said unto him, One thing thou lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow me.”</p>
<p><i>Jesus loved us</i></p> <p><i>Ephesians 5:2</i> “And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us...”</p>	<p><i>Revelation 1:5</i> “And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood,”</p>

<p><i>Jesus Loved the Father</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Christ displays divine love by His SUBMISSION. 	<p><i>John 14:31</i> “But that the world may know that I love the Father; and as the Father gave me commandment, even so I do. Arise, let us go hence.”</p>

3) Grace and Truth

John 1:14 “And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.”

John 1:17 “For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.”

John 14:6 “Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.”

2 Corinthians 11:10 “As the truth of Christ is in me, no man shall stop me of this boasting in the regions of Achaia.”

Romans 16:24 “The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen.”

3. His Authority

a. As Lord, Jesus has the Power to commission and command

Matthew 28:18 “And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.

John 3:35 “The Father loveth the Son, and hath given all things into his hand.”

b. As God, Jesus has the Power to forgive sin

Mark 2:5 “When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy, Son, thy sins be forgiven thee.”

Mark 2:7 “Why doth this man thus speak blasphemies? who can forgive sins but God only?”

Mark 2:10 “But that ye may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (he saith to the sick of the palsy,)”

c. As Saviour, Jesus has the Power to give eternal life

John 17:2 “As thou hast given him power over all flesh, that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him.”

John 10:28 “And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand.”

d. **As Judge**, Jesus has the Power to execute judgment as King

John 5:22 “For the Father judgeth no man, but hath committed all judgment unto the Son:”

John 5:26-27 “For as the Father hath life in himself; so hath he given to the Son to have life in himself;(27) And hath given him authority to execute judgment also, because he is the Son of man.”

2 Timothy 4:1 “I charge thee therefore before God, and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the quick and the dead at his appearing and his kingdom;”

e. **Jesus is recognized as the OLD TESTAMENT Jehovah**

4. His Honour

a. Jesus is honoured and worshiped

John 5:23 *“That all men should honour the Son, even as they honour the Father. He that honoureth not the Son honoureth not the Father which hath sent him.”*

- Jesus is more than an ambassador who is coming on behalf of God; God gives Jesus full and complete equality with the Father.
- Jesus makes it very clear that the only way anyone can honour the Father is through receiving and submitting themselves to the Son. The Jews actually blasphemed the Father by their rejection of His Son.

1) Angels Worshipped Jesus

Hebrews 1:6 *“And again, when he bringeth in the firstbegotten into the world, he saith, And let all the angels of God worship him.”*

Matthew 25:31 “When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory:”

Revelation 4:8 “And the four beasts had each of them six wings about him; and they were full of eyes within: and they rest not day and night, saying, Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come.”

2) Wise Men = (Astronomers, Scientists) Worshipped Jesus

Matthew 2:1-2 “Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, (2) Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.

3) The Disciples Worshipped Jesus

Matthew 14:32-33 “And when they were come into the ship, the wind ceased. (33) Then they that were in the ship came and worshipped him, saying, Of a truth thou art the Son of God.

Matthew 28:9 “And as they went to tell his disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, All hail. And they came and held him by the feet, and worshipped him.”

Luke 24:51-52 “And it came to pass, while he blessed them, he was parted from them, and carried up into heaven. (52) And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy:

4) The whole world one day will Worship Jesus

- This does not mean that everyone will be saved, but rather that all men will acknowledge the Lordship of Christ, and will be compelled to bow to Him.

Philippians 2:9-11 “Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: (10) That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; (11) And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.”

- If a person desires to bring glory to God, then they must worship the Lord Jesus. JW’s do not honour the Son as they Honour God – Jehovah.

b. Only God is to be Worshipped

Exodus 34:14 “For thou shalt worship no other god: for the LORD, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God:”

Acts 10:25-26 “And as Peter was coming in, Cornelius met him, and fell down at his feet, and worshipped him.(26) But Peter took him up, saying, Stand up; I myself also am a man.”

Revelation 22:8-9 “And I John saw these things, and heard them. And when I had heard and seen, I fell down to worship before the feet of the angel which shewed me these things. (9) Thensaith he unto me, See thou do it not: for I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren the prophets, and of them which keep the sayings of this book: worship God.”
